## BCCWC BIRTHDAY PARTY

### BCCWC, THE FIRST YEAR

To tell the story of the BCCWC to those who were not around, I decided to ask those basic questions - who, what, when, where, why and how.

When we were originally part of the De Pere Woman's Club, there were many who thought it would be better if we could keep our dues and the money we raised in Brown County to benefit our local community. At that time, all the dues were going to Madison and Washington D.C. to

support the national federation ...so we took a vote. It turned out that the majority wanted to leave. The DPWC very graciously gave us half of the treasury which enabled us to begin. We set up a task force in March to decide our future. The task force was chaired by Lynette VanDenHeuvel, and included Charlotte Rondou, Kathy Heyroth, Carol Simpson, Fran Fey, Marilyn Lemerond, Zita Turriff and Mary Schall.



Our first meeting was March 4, 2008. We met in our homes, meeting rooms and restaurants, eventually coming up with a constitution, by-laws, and policies and procedures that enabled us to function as a club. After much brainstorming, the entire club voted to name ourselves the Brown County Community Women's Club (BCCWC) on March 19. We went to the De Pere Park Board to request a meeting room, we scheduled meetings and fundraising events. We had a Kick-off pot-luck luncheon at the Kress Library in June 2008 for Charter Members and the BCCWC was on the move!

What I remember most about those early days is the spirit and dedication of all the members. We were a very tight group determined to make this a club in which everyone felt they belonged and in which we could have a great time working together to make our community a better place. We also knew we wanted to benefit our own members by giving everyone a chance to do some good in a way that they could contribute. Volunteer opportunities were set up and our small group realized that "If everyone does a little, no one has to do a lot." *But we all did a lot, and we had lots of fun!*

The Book Club had begun, we were volunteering at St Vincent de Paul, we were having group outings to plays. We decorated a boat and ourselves and marched in the Memorial Day Parade. We had a Spring Lunch and Fashion Show at Oneida. Our gardening group kept the New Kress Library garden weeded and beautiful. The first directory was ready for the beginning of the new year - 2009. We manned the blood drive at SNC. We were also frying brats at Festival Foods led by Nina Wargin.

A jazzy time was had in October at Oneida Golf Club with a pianist who entertained after dinner. Lynette won his concert in an auction and set up this elegant fundraiser. In November, we had a Spaghetti Dinner that was also a success with all members participating. In December, we made cookies for Santa's house and we all worked to get Carly Busse's house ready for a Christmas sale and cooking demonstrations. Carol Simpson got the Card and Game Day started and continued the success of the Bridge Marathons.

It was an extremely busy time, but we all enjoyed it and had much to celebrate at the end of the year when we were able to donate to all the local charities chosen by our members.

Lap-size quilt examples are 48 X 50, 52, 54, 56 or 60 X 60 - nothing much bigger - should be a size similar to a throw for a living room. Each quilter provides a backing. The batting and machine quilting are free of charge.


