
## FORT HOWARD SENIOR LUNCHEONS - Needs for Bingo


## **FELLOWSHIP**

Monday, January 7, we meet at the Kress Family Library in De Pere at 1:00 PM. Marge Bork will be our discussion leader for WE WERE THE LUCKY ONES by Georgia Hunter.

We gather again at Kress Library on Monday, February 4, at 1:00 PM to discuss The Bad-Ass Librarians of Timbuktu: and Their Race to Save the World's Most Precious Manuscripts, by Joshua Hammer. Meg Deem will head the discussion.

SUMMARY OF BOOK: To save precious centuries-old Arabic texts from Al Qaeda, a band of librarians



in Timbuktu pulls off a brazen heist worthy of Ocean's Eleven. In the 1980s, a young adventurer and collector for the government library, Abdel Kader Haidara, journeyed across the Sahara Desert salvaging tens of thousands of ancient Islamic and secular manuscripts that had fallen into obscurity. He became one of the world's great smugglers and brought volumes to safety in Mali in 2012.

Over the past twenty years, journalist Joshua Hammer visited Timbuktu numerous times researching. He explored the city's manuscript heritage and offers neverbefore-reported details about the militants' march into Africa. This book is an inspiring account of the victory of art and literature over extremism.
