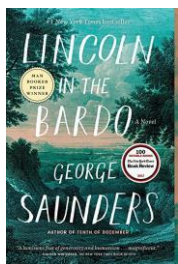
Our book is *Born a Crime* by George Saunders.

**SUMMARY:** American master George Saunders delivers his most original, transcendent, moving work yet. Unfolding in a graveyard over the course of a single night, narrated by a dazzling chorus of voices, *Lincoln in the Bardo* is a literary experience unlike any other—for no one but Saunders could conceive it.



February 1862. The Civil War is less than one year old. The fighting has begun in earnest, and the nation has begun to realize it is in for a long, bloody struggle.

Meanwhile, President Lincoln's eleven-year-old son, Willie, lies upstairs in the White House gravely ill. In a matter of days, despite predictions of recovery, Willie dies and is laid to rest in a Georgetown cemetery. "My poor boy, he was too good for this earth," the President says at the time. "God has called him home." Newspapers report that a grief-stricken Lincoln returned to the crypt several times alone to hold his boy's body.

Saunders spins an unforgettable story of love and loss. It breaks free of its realistic, historical framework into a thrilling, supernatural realm both hilarious and terrifying. Willie finds himself in a strange purgatory, where ghosts mingle, gripe, commiserate, quarrel, and enact bizarre acts of penance. Within this transitional state—called, in Tibetan tradition, the Bardo—a monumental struggle erupts over Willie's soul. How do we live and love when we know that everything we love must end?
