

Guests of the Altrusa House generally live more than 50 miles from Green Bay, are in financial need, or require an extended stay in Green Bay while receiving medical assistance at an area hospital.

BUILDING QUILTS FOR HABITAT FOR HUMANITY

The mom also was pretty emotional. It was very touching. The house was decorated for Christmas with a tree and special ornaments for each child. We were able to tour the house. The 5-year-old twins have their bedrooms and a bathroom in the basement which they were super excited to show off.

DONATE A BUCK - GET A BOOK




