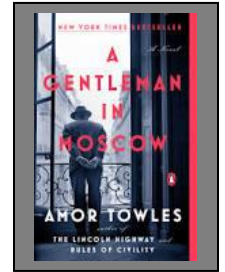

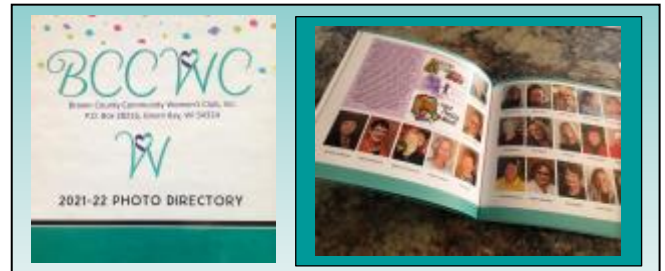

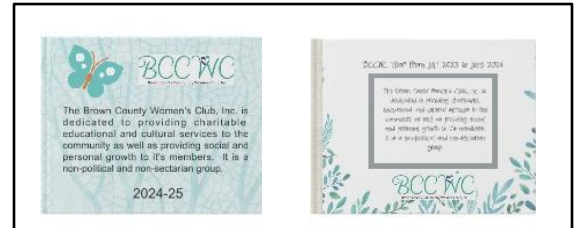

IN MEMORIAM



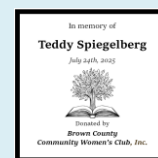
