The selection is *Remarkably Bright Creatures* by Shelby Van Pelt which is an exploration of friendship, reckoning, and hope, tracing a widow's unlikely connection with a giant Pacific octopus. This is Shelby Van Pelt's debut novel.

## **Book Summary:**



After Tova Sullivan's husband died, she began working the night shift at the Sowell Bay Aquarium, mopping floors and tidying up. Keeping busy has always helped her cope, which she's been doing since her 18-year-old son, Erik, mysteriously vanished on a boat in Puget Sound over 30 years ago.

Tova becomes acquainted with curmudgeonly Marcellus, a giant Pacific octopus living at the aquarium. Marcellus knows more than anyone can imagine, but wouldn't dream of lifting one of his eight arms for his human captors—until he forms a remarkable friendship with Tova.

Ever the detective, Marcellus deduces what happened the night Tova's son disappeared. Now Marcellus must use every trick his old invertebrate body can muster to unearth the truth for her before it's too late.


