ST. JOHN'S MINISTRIES-MEN'S HOMELESS SHELTER AND WOMEN'S HOMELESS SHELTER MEALS



BCCWC members will be providing dinner meals at BOTH shelters on the ***first Thursday of each month from November 2026-April 2027***. We will have sign-up sheets for the entire season at the **September 16** luncheon even though the first meal is not until **November 5**. Our season is as follows: November 5, 2026; December 3, 2026; January 7, 2027; February 4, 2027; March 4, 2027; and April 1, 2027. Our nutritious menu will continue to be the same as previous years: lasagna, lettuce salad with assorted dressings, garlic bread, hot vegetables, milk and dessert. The guests always look forward to and appreciate our delicious meals, both the flavors and the amount. You will also have the opportunity to sign up to serve the meals at either shelter as well.

This summer has been very busy at both shelters. New programs have been tried at both shelters to continue to serve nightly meals until the regular season starts November 1. Meals have been prepared by one group,

and have been served by the people who volunteered to serve that night. Daytime support help has been increased as well for the guests. The future of these trial programs will be evaluated at the end of the season. Two free evening learning presentations are available for volunteers: one about communicating with the guests (September 21) and one about de-escalating difficult situations (October 12). See one of the co-chairs for information.

We thank everyone who has so generously contributed in the past and we look forward to your enthusiastic support again at both shelters this season! We anticipate the number of those who need this service will increase.

Lovable Misfits were started to provide comfort to children in need or in a stressful situation. What kind of situation you may ask ... You are with an adult and you get pulled over by a policeman. Your adult is arrested and you are taken someplace safe. There is a fire and your house burns down. These are just two examples.

What are Misfits? We use new fleece and make soft, silly, lovable creatures. We make a little quilt out of fleece and flannel. The two items fit inside a gallon zip lock bag.

We have delivered Misfits to Golden House, Freedom House, Willow Tree, fire departments, police departments, social services, and we are looking to expand to sexual assault services. How can you help? Can you sew? If so, we distribute a zip lock bag with the "Misfit" all cut out and ready to sew together. We also provide a zip lock bag with a little quilt to be sewn

together. Everything is cut out and ready to go. We just need you to sew them together and bring them back to the next meeting.

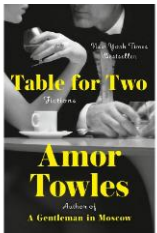

Book Summary:



Readers of Amor Towles are in for a treat as he shares six short stories set in New York City and a novella in Los Angeles. The New York stories, most of which are set around the turn of the millennium, take up everything from the death-defying acrobatics of the male ego, to the fateful consequences of brief encounters and the delicate mechanics of compromise. Told from seven points of view, the novella "Eve in Hollywood" describes how one of Towles' most beloved characters, the indomitable Evelyn Ross from *Rules of Civility*, crafts a new future for herself—and others.

When you're looking at your directory, recognize that a lot of work went into putting it together. The person responsible for that this year is Laurie Rentmeester, who did a fabulous job!



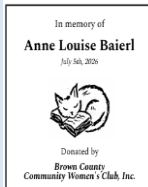
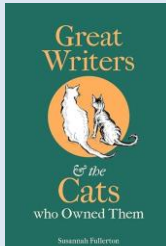

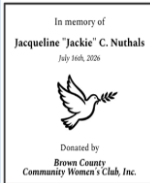
